In May, the Oklahoma Disciples Foundation board of directors adopted a new mission statement:

The mission of the foundation is to sustain an enduring financial basis for Christ's ministry through the prudent investment of funds to ensure a legacy of Christian principles and institutions.

Even if you have never seen the Foundation's previous mission statement, you might wonder, why adopt a new one? The answer: it is sometimes almost as much about the process as the product.

Considering what elements should be included in a mission statement requires that the members of the group tap into their shared vision. Developing the statement precipitates a discussion of ideals, values, and ethics. While Foundation board meetings always begin with a devotion and prayer, much of the board's time is spent focusing on specific agenda items: new or unfinished business such as budget reviews, committee reports, and investment data.

Talking about the Foundation's mission encourages a focus on strategic issues rather than tactics and implementation. Such long-range vision is crucial to the endurance and legacy of an organization.

ODF's mission-statement evaluation process began during a board retreat almost a year ago. Our retreat

facilitator instructed directors to list ideas about what should be included in the organization's mission statement. Concepts and concerns such as ministry, faith, service, stewardship and legacy emerged as common themes. All the proposed elements served

as the basis of several draft versions of a statement. During subsequent board meetings, time was devoted to reviewing and reflecting on the Foundation's mission and on revising and finetuning the drafts. Board members were asked to pray about the final proposed draft before the May meeting, when the matter would come up for a vote.

A mission statement can serve as a grounding resource when a controversial matter must be addressed. It should be capable

of providing guidance when there is an issue or problem. A mission statement clarifies who we are and our purpose – what we stand for and why we do the things we do.

It is conventional for organizations – ranging from

global corporations to local churches – to have a mission statement. And there is a multitude of resources and guidelines for constructing family mission statements as well as personal mission statements.

Whether you have a statement of purpose that is <u>recorded</u> somewhere, have you asked yourself "am I fulfilling God's

purpose for my life?" and "what will my legacy be?" Anyone who thinks he is too small to make a difference has never been bitten by a mosquito!

I mostly visit patients three times a week on assigned floors, but I am also learning how to provide ministry and other services to trauma patients and their families, as well as how to provide ministry in times of death.... Most of my ministry has been as a chaplain, but I also enjoy preaching and having the opportunity to get to know parishioners over an extended length of time.

[My] scholarship really eases the financial pressure of going to school, making it possible for me to concentrate on my studies and my ministry, without having to worry so much how the bills are going to be paid, or having to worry about taking out loans and having to repay them."
